Divrei Halev - Words from the Heart

The Perfect Rabbi

The search is on for Temple Emanu-El's next Senior Rabbi. In the coming days the Rabbinic Search Committee will review resumes, interview candidates, and recommend the best candidate for the position, a Rabbi who I hope will serve and lead the Temple well for many years to come.

Of course, everyone will want the "perfect" Rabbi; and everyone has a different opinion of what the "perfect" Rabbi should be; that's what makes choosing the next Rabbi so important and such a daunting task.

For what it is worth, I will share with you the characteristics and attributes and skills that I believe the "perfect" Rabbi should possess. They are as follows:

- The "perfect" Rabbi should be a Jew! Not just in title, but in every part of his/her being. The "perfect" Rabbi should live and breathe being a Jew; the Rabbi's Jewishness should emanate from every fiber of his/her body and soul.
- The "perfect" Rabbi should be grounded in a deep understanding of our Jewish faith, with a remarkable ability to articulate that understanding in a way that speaks to the issues of our day and the challenges of our time. The "perfect" Rabbi should be able to translate the ancient and eternal values of Judaism based on the encounter of our people with the Divine, and transform those values into the everyday life of our congregation.
- The "perfect" Rabbi should possess a deep and unconditional love for the Land of Israel and continue to see that the State of Israel represents one of the truly great miracles of Jewish history, and the "perfect" Rabbi should work tirelessly to imbue that love for Israel into the hearts and minds of the Jewish People.

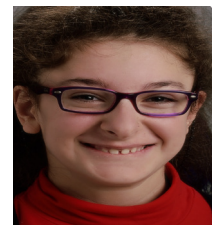

Looking for a new Matzah Ball Recipe? Try these Vegan Matzah Balls and let us know what you think!

The brilliance of this recipe is that you don't boil the matzah balls. You bake them! This way, they stay intact. The quinoa holds the mix together (and adds protein). (Recipe by Lisa Dawn Angermae)

Makes 24 Matzah Balls

Ingredients:

- 1 cup quinoa flakes
- 2 cups boiling water
- One box (2 packets) matzah ball mix
- 1/4 cup light vegetable oil (like safflower)

Directions:

1. In a large mixing bowl, cover the quinoa flakes with the water. Let stand for 2 or 3 minutes.
2. Stir in both packets of matzah meal mix along with the oil, and mix until well blended. Cover the bowl and refrigerate for at least 15 minutes.
3. Just before baking, preheat the oven to 275 F.
4. Roll the mixture into approximately 1-inch balls; don't pack them too firmly. Arrange on a parchment-lined baking sheet. Bake for 20 to 25 minutes, carefully turning the matzo balls after 10 minutes, until firm to the touch; don't let them brown.
5. If making ahead of time, let the matzah balls cool completely, then cover until needed. Warm them briefly in a medium oven and distribute them among the soup bowls, allowing 3 or 4 matzah balls per serving.

Divrei Halev - Words from the Heart

- The “perfect” Rabbi, through teaching, preaching, writing, guiding, cajoling, encouraging, and most important, “modeling” – that “perfect” Rabbi should lead us in such a way that we create and build lives of meaning and significance, that the Temple becomes a “tabernacle” of holiness and safety, and that our community grows to reflect the very best of what a Jewish community is all about.
- The “perfect” Rabbi should teach us by example, and expect from us, that we treat each other with respect and honor, that we do everything in our power to prevent “lashon harah” (the inappropriate use of language) from falling from our tongues, that we honor our teachers, care for our elderly, and prove to be worthy mentors for our young.

And the “perfect” Rabbi should help us live with a deep sense of wonder, what it means to live in a world fashioned by God, given to us as a precious gift, and treated by us as a treasured legacy to behold each and every day.

Yes, that’s the “perfect” Rabbi for me. I hope and pray that is the “perfect” Rabbi for you and the “perfect” Rabbi that is chosen for Temple Emanu-El.
